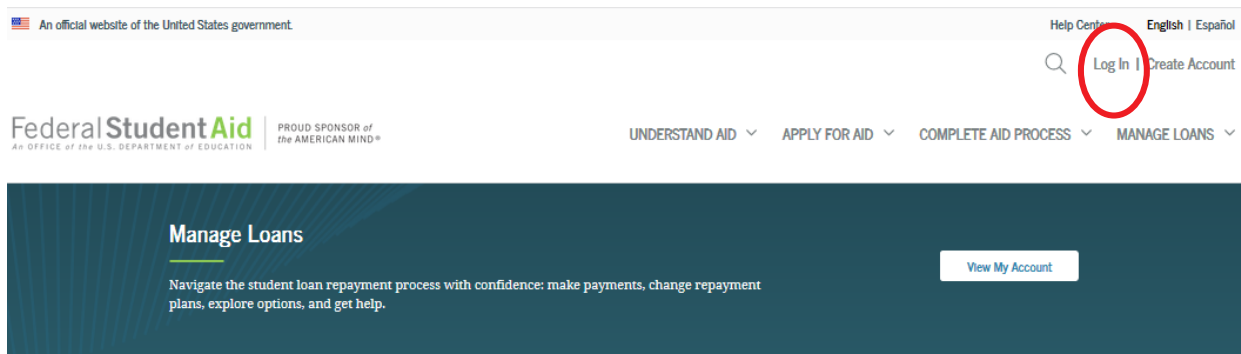

REQUIRED EXIT COUNSELING INSTRUCTIONS




Federal Direct Loan regulations require federal student loan borrowers to complete Federal Direct Loan Exit Counseling upon graduation, leave of absence, or withdrawal. Exit counseling provides you important information regarding loan repayment options and your obligations as a student loan borrower.

Exit counseling must be completed at studentaid.gov.

STEP 1: Visit studentaid.gov.

STEP 2: Select **Log In** located in the upper right of page.

- Sign in using your federal FSA ID.

STEP 3: Click on **Manage Loans** on upper right tool bar.

- Under **I'm About to Graduate or Leave College**, click **Complete Exit Counseling**.
- Click START, complete exit counseling and submit.
 - o Take notice of which federal loan servicer(s) is assigned to your federal loans.
 - o Contact your assigned federal loan servicer directly for any questions.
 - o Bookmark studentaid.gov for future loan repayment information.
