STEP 1: Visit studentaid.gov.

- **STEP 2:** Under In School tab, click on **Apply for a PLUS Loan for Graduate School**.
 - Log in using your federal FSA ID.
- **STEP 3:** Click START to begin the **Graduate PLUS application**.
 - Select an **award year**.
 - Enter school, loan amount, and loan period (i.e. for fall/spring: August 2020 May 2021).
 - Complete authorizations and submit application.
- **STEP 4:** Complete Graduate PLUS Entrance Counseling.
 - Under In School tab, click Complete Loan Entrance Counseling.

o Select **Complete Entrance Counseling** as a graduate or professional student.

- STEP 5: Complete Graduate PLUS Master Promissory Note (MPN).
 - Under In School tab, click Complete a Loan Agreement (Master Promissory Note).
 - Select PLUS MPN for Graduate/Professional Students.
