Target	The course proposes to offer adequate documentation and the critical methods useful to the interpretation of the above mentioned texts and to their translation from original language into Italian. It will deal with both the linguistic and the contextual/cultural themes implied in its title. It means, moreover, to introduce the student to the various aspects of written American English, in its highest forms, in a span of time that covers the second half of the 19th century (Twain) and both halves of the 20th century (Wharton, Stein, Santayana, De Lillo).
