GENERAL INFORMATION

ACCREDITATION AND/OR PROGRAMS

Nazareth University of Rochester is incorporated under the authority of the Board of Regents of the University of the State of New York and is an accredited member of the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools. It is approved by the New York State Education Department for the training of veterans and other eligible persons.

Nazareth University is an independent (non-profit) comprehensive university offering baccalaureate, master's and professional doctorate degrees. The University holds membership in the American Council on Education and the Association of American Colleges and Universities. Program accreditation includes: Creative Arts Therapy (NYS Licensure Qualifying; Art Therapy program accredited by the American Art Therapy Association; Music Therapy program accredited by the National Association of Schools of Music and approved by the American Music Therapy Association); Education (Teacher Education Accreditation Council); Music (National Association of Schools of Music); Nursing (Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education); Physical Therapy (Commission on Accreditation in Physical Therapy Education); Social Work (Council on Social Work Education); Speech Language Pathology (Council on Academic Accreditation in Audiology and Speech Language Pathology). In addition, the School of Management is a member of the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB), and has specialized accreditation for its business programs through the International Assembly of Collegiate Business Education (IACBE).

DEGREES

Nazareth University of Rochester awards the undergraduate degrees of Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Fine Arts, Bachelor of Music, Bachelor of Science. Graduate degrees are Master of Arts, Master of Science, Master of Science in Education, Master of Social Work (joint program, Nazareth and SUNY Brockport) and Doctor of Physical Therapy. A combined Bachelor of Science-Master of Science in Education may also be awarded.

For students who have been dismissed for academic reasons, only grades of C or better from the student's previous record, and/or in transfer, will be accepted toward the degree. The GPA will be calculated only on credits earned after readmission; a minimum of 30 credits, with a cumulative GPA of 2.0, will be required for graduation.
