# INTRODUCTION TO FERPA



### WHAT IS FERPA?

### **FERPA Overview**

FERPA is a federal law protecting the privacy of student education records since 1974.

### Student Rights Under FERPA

Students have the right to access, amend, and control disclosure of their education records.

### Impact on Families

College students gain control over records; parents lose automatic access, ensuring student privacy.



### WHEN DO FERPA RIGHTS TRANSFER?

### FERPA Rights Transfer Criteria

FERPA rights transfer to students at age 18 or upon enrollment in postsecondary education, promoting student privacy and autonomy.

### Student Control Over Records

Eligible students gain full control over their academic records, restricting parental access without written consent.

### **Exceptions to Rights Transfer**

Parents may retain access if student is tax dependent or during health and safety emergencies.

### Preparing for Communication Changes

Understanding FERPA helps families adjust to new communication and access protocols in college life.

### UNDERSTANDING EDUCATION RECORDS



### WHAT ARE EDUCATION RECORDS?

### **Definition of Education Records**

Education records include grades, transcripts, schedules, disciplinary files, and financial aid information directly related to students.

### Formats of Records


These records may be stored as paper documents, electronic files, or emails maintained by educational institutions or their agents.

### **FERPA Rights and Protection**

FERPA grants students rights to access, amend, and control who views their education records, ensuring confidentiality and integrity.

### Family Access Considerations

Family members need student permission to access records, preserving student privacy and security of academic information.



### **CAN PARENTS SEE RECORDS?**

### **FERPA Privacy Basics**

Parents cannot access student education records without written consent under FERPA, ensuring student privacy.


### **Exceptions to Access**

Parents may access records if the student is a tax-dependent or in health and safety emergencies.

### Family Communication

Families should discuss FERPA scenarios and consider signing release forms for better communication.

# FERPA AND DIRECTORY INFORMATION



### WHAT IS DIRECTORY INFORMATION?

### **Definition of Directory Information**

Directory information includes basic student details colleges may disclose unless the student opts out.

### Student Rights and Privacy

Students can restrict release of directory information especially for privacy or safety concerns.

### Institutional Policy Variations

Each college defines directory information differently and students should review policies carefully.

### COMMON MISUNDERSTANDINGS



### Parental Access to Grades

Parents need written consent from students to access their academic grades under FERPA regulations.



### **School Notification Limits**

Schools typically communicate directly with students, not parents, regarding academic or disciplinary issues.



### Importance of Education

Families should educate themselves on FERPA and discuss information sharing to avoid confusion and frustration.

### TIPS FOR FAMILIES

### Understanding FERPA Rights

Families should understand FERPA to respect students' privacy and know when to encourage release forms.

### **Promoting Open Communication**

Encourage honest conversations about privacy and expectations to foster trust between students and families.

### Supporting Student Independence

Guide students to manage their responsibilities while respecting boundaries to nurture autonomy and growth.

# FERPA COMPLIANCE AND FINAL THOUGHTS



### WHAT SCHOOLS MUST DO

### Record Disclosure Management

Schools are required to maintain records of all disclosures of student information for accountability and transparency.

### Privacy and Information Security

Schools must ensure student information is shared only under authorized conditions to protect privacy.

### Family Advocacy and Awareness

Families should understand school obligations to advocate for students and ensure FERPA rights are respected.



### **QUESTIONS & ANSWERS**

### Access to Student Grades

Parents can access student grades only if a FERPA release form is signed by the student.

### Support for Struggling Students

Encourage students to use campus resources; FERPA permits disclosure in emergencies or for tax-dependent students.

### **Financial Aid Information Access**

Parents may view financial aid details with student consent or if claiming them as a tax-dependent.

Nazareth University FERPA Permission to Release Form

If a student wishes to grant access to a parent or 3<sup>rd</sup> party, a <u>Permission to</u> <u>Disclose Education Records</u> form must be completed for each person being granted permission.
