Introduction

In compliance with the federal Stop Campus Hazing Act (H.R. 5646), the Campus Hazing Transparency Report (CHTR) discloses both reports and findings of responsibility for hazing violations occurring after **July 1**, **2025**. This report is updated bi-annually and maintained for a period of **seven (7) years** from the date of publication.

- A finding is a determination, following an investigation, that a hazing violation has occurred.
- In the spirit of transparency and accountability Nazareth University has decided to include both reports and findings in this report.
