Campus Hazing Transparency Report (CHTR)

Introduction

This Campus Hazing Transparency Report (CHTR) discloses both reports and findings of responsibility for hazing violations occurring after **December 10, 2025**. This report is updated bi-annually and maintained for a period of **seven (7) years** from the date of publication.

Reports vs. Findings

- A **report** refers to any allegation of hazing submitted to the university. Not all reports result in a formal investigation or finding of responsibility. Statistics on all reported incidents, regardless of outcome, are available in the Annual Security Report (ASR).
- A **finding** is a determination, following an investigation, that a hazing violation has occurred.
- In the spirit of transparency and accountability Nazareth University has decided to include both reports and findings in this report.

Description of Violation: On the above date and time Campus Safety Officers responded to Parking Lot H following a report of a suspicious vehicle. Investigating Officers were informed that the vehicle in question was involved in a "tradition" related to the above team. Further investigation indicates that the tradition revolves around new team members jogging on campus immediately after eating and in weather that was in the single digits factoring wind chill.

Notice of Finding Issue: [1/23/2026]

Sanctions: [Probation: The team is on disciplinary probation effective January 21, 2026, through May 31, 2027. Team is expected to refrain from any further campus violations during the designated period; any further violations may result in suspension or termination from Nazareth University. During the probation period, team leaders are required to meet monthly with Vicky Gebel, Associate Dean of Students for Campus Life. A point of contact for the team leaders must schedule the first meeting with Vicky Gebel by January 30th. First meeting must take place by February 6, 2026. During monthly meetings, team leaders will discuss with Vicky steps to complete the following:

Participate in a Restorative Circle to discuss this incident and how you will move forward as a team by the end of the Spring 2026 semester. Create a team culture plan to outline how you will build team culture, evaluate current team traditions, and create new ones - due by May 1, 2026. Create a workshop that will be offered to all student athletes, educating them on Nazareth hazing policies - due by August 1, 2026.]
