ST Queer Anthropology

Since its inception, American anthropology has been shaped by engagement with the social and psychological intersections of human sexuality. This course will explore this dynamic history by presenting classic and contemporary ethnographic works that address cross-cultural variation and the discursive construction of sexuality. Students will consider how these works intersect with traditional anthropological concerns such as kinship, community, religion, economics, power, and identity.
